GREEN TIP - The next few weeks of “Green Tips” will highlight the storing of fresh fruits and vegetables. Generally speaking, it is best to store fruits at room temperature. If you want to slow down the ripening process, put it in the refrigerator. If you want something to ripen more quickly, put it in a tightly closed paper bag with a ripe banana, do not refrigerate.
